Description

Chuck Smith explores the significance of the Last Supper, emphasizing the new meaning of the bread and cup as a remembrance of Jesus' sacrifice. He reflects on Jesus' anguish in the Garden of Gethsemane, where He wished for the cup of suffering to pass but ultimately accepted it as the only path to salvation. Smith highlights Jesus' prophetic knowledge of the pain and mockery He would endure, including physical suffering and spiritual separation from the Father. Despite this, Jesus chose to drink from the cup for the joy set before Him, demonstrating His love and commitment to humanity's redemption.
