Scripture: Matthew 9:13, Luke 15:1, 2 Timothy 1:9

Topics: "Gods Love", "Spiritual Restoration"

Description

In this sermon, the speaker tells a story about a woman who experiences different emotions throughout her life. She starts off feeling content and joyful after getting married and having a baby. However, tragedy strikes when her baby falls ill and she realizes that the child is going to die. The speaker uses this story to illustrate how sin and the enemy can dirty and tear us apart, but God still sees our value. He emphasizes that the Gospel is the answer to our brokenness and that Jesus came to heal and restore us. The sermon concludes with a reference to a Bible verse about having a clean heart and a washed body.

Transcript

It's wonderful to be in the presence of God. We have the assurance that we're two or three again that he's here in our midst. We thank you this morning for so great a service.

He said he chose this. Maybe one day she was making her way through the marketplace or maybe it was again the sadness of their life which he said if he can do bringing Jesus and his begins when we acknowledge that we're a sinner. Jesus again, here she is totally broken.
