Martin Luther's Morning Prayer emphasizes the importance of expressing gratitude, seeking protection, and trusting in God's care.

Scripture: Psalm 19:14, Psalm 25:5, Psalm 91:11, Psalm 121:7

Topics: "Morning Prayer", "Spiritual Protection"

Description

Martin Luther's morning prayer expresses gratitude to God for protection from evil and danger throughout the night and seeks continued protection from evil and sin for the day ahead. Luther surrenders himself completely to God's care, asking for guidance for all his actions to be pleasing to God. He also requests the presence of God's holy Angels to guard him against the enemy's influence.
